### LIEUTENANTS - SEA DUTY.

A preliminary survey indicates considerable shortage of lieutenants in combatant ships for the fiscal year 1940. The Bureau will consider requests for an extension of sea duty from officers junior to the Class of 1924 who are due for shore duty in the Spring of 1939. This does not apply to officers serving in submarines unless they wish to be transferred to surface vessels, or to naval aviation.

The name "Hornet" was selected by the President in 1936 for the next aircraft carrier to be constructed which is to be known as the CV8.

NEW SHIPS (contd.).

Battleships BB57 to BB60 and Cruisers CL51 and CL52 were authorized to be constructed by the Act of March 27, 1934. Cruisers CL53 and CL54 and the Aircraft Carrier CV8 were authorized by the Act of May 17, 1938.

HARBOR SERVICES.

On 16 August 1935 the Bureau requested Commanding Officers of all ships to submit at the end of each quarter a report of expenditures for pilotage, towage, wharfage, and similar services, showing the locations where the charges were incurred. In a number of instances the report of expenditures by locations does not agree in amount with the expenditures reported on S. & A. Form 20 for such services. It is requested that the quarterly report of expenditures by locations be reconciled with S. & A. Form 20 before forwarding to the Bureau.

If no expenditures were incurred for harbor services, it is not necessary to submit the report of expenditures by locations.

NAVAL ACADEMY PREPARATORY SCHOOL.

Listed below, by vessels to which attached, are the names of 95 enlisted men who have been selected by preliminary written examination to attend the Naval Academy Preparatory School beginning 1 November 1938 at the U. S. Naval Training Station, Norfolk, Va.

Since there are not enough successful candidates to fill the allowed quota of 100 (even if all men selected for the school should be able to pass the entrance examinations), it is the desire of the Bureau of Navigation that candidates of ability who have insufficient sea duty for selection for the school be encouraged to continue their studies at sea as prospective candidates for the Naval Academy Entrance Examinations to be given in April, 1939.

It is also desired that candidates who are not able to enter the school because of minor physical deficiencies be encouraged to correct these if, in the opinion of the medical officers of their respective vessels, such deficiencies could be corrected prior to April, 1939.

Candidates who, because of insufficient sea duty by 1 November 1938 are permitted to enter the school at a later date should spend as much time as practicable in the study of the required subjects prior to transfer to the school.
