

Tool for Managing Traffic Risks Now Easily Accessible Online

Sailors looking for ways to recognize traffic risks now have access to a new source at the Army Safety Management System (ASMIS).

Recently made available to Navy personnel, ASMIS is an online, interactive program that guides users through a risk-analysis survey of any upcoming road trips.

After registering at the ASMIS site, users provide the details of their planned trip, such as starting point, destination and driving habits. After the data is processed, the program generates tailor-made risk analysis for the traveler, as well as specific guidance on how to lower potential risks.

The color-coded risk management matrix program graphically displays whether a trip is relatively safe or potentially dangerous. Additionally, the system provides safety information such as fatigue, night driving, road rage and vehicular-mishap case studies similar to the user's planned excursion.

A key feature of the new system is that it e-mails a copy of the analysis to the user's supervisor, allowing both to discuss possible dangers and ways to reduce them.
