

## Navy Reserve Launches Next Phase of Forcewide Communication

Communicating with more than 100,000 Navy Reservists and other key constituents worldwide has been a daunting task over the years. However, the commander of Navy Reserve Forces Command (CNRFC), launched 21st century technology June 25 to solve an age-old challenge.

Reservists and others interested in the Navy Reserve Force can sign up for CNRFC's list server for reserve-related information via e-mail. The list server will replace the current force e-mail distribution list (FEDL), which currently uses large distribution lists in the Microsoft Outlook program to send information to 8,000 recipients.

People can subscribe for up to 13 e-mail groups at <https://listserv.navyreserve.navy.mil>. The service is open to everyone. Topics include news, training and mobilization opportunities, benefits and family issues. Further, people can easily unsubscribe from any list whenever they choose.

Communication remains the top challenge for the Navy Reserve Force, with members and stakeholders spread across the globe.

During the initial launch phase, messages will continue to be sent using the FEDL to ensure uninterrupted delivery. CNRFC staff expects to complete migration to the list server and end use of the FEDL by Aug. 1.
