



NPC Wants to Know How Sailors Prefer to Get Information

Navy leaders would like to know how many Sailors have access to the Internet and their preferred method for receiving Navy information. These are just some of the questions Navy Personnel Command's Center for Career Development (CCD) is asking Sailors in the 2008 Communications Quick Poll, released March 12.



The Navy is currently polling 7,000 Sailors on

communication as part of the Navy's Quick Poll program used to measure Sailor's views on specific issues. Sailors who have been selected to participate have until March 24 to complete this on-line poll.

Maximum participation is desired to achieve the best results.

Sailors are randomly selected to participate in the poll. Participants will be notified by their command career counselor.

Quick polling, managed by NPRST, is designed to target one specific subject with a limited number of questions and provide Navy leaders with results within a few weeks.

The Quick Poll Web site will only allow the randomly selected Sailors notified via Navy message to log in and complete the poll. Results of previous polls are also available on the Quick Poll Web site at <http://quickpolling.nprst.navy.mil/results.htm>.

Results of the 2007 Enlisted Education Quick Poll were part of the data used to support the recent change to Navy tuition assistance policy which now allows use within one year of a Sailor's end of obligated service.
