Navy Announces New SRB levels

Navy has adjusted Selective Reenlistment Program (SRB) levels to match reenlistment needs for critical skills and ratings, including the hardest to fill areas such as nuclear operators, Aegis fire controlmen, and air intercept controllers.

Naval Administrative message 175/10 approves 24 increases in SRB award levels and 10 decreases. Award levels in 124 categories remain unchanged, one was added and 12 award levels were removed.



The Selective Reenlistment Bonus program allows the Navy to properly incentivize high-demand Sailors with critical skills to maintain a prepared force which is ready and able to execute global operations in today's complex security environment. The program helps maintain critical skill retention goals and allows the Navy to maximize use of allotted resources.

SRB is a dynamic market-based incentive designed to retain Sailors in the Navy's most critical ratings and Navy Enlisted Classifications.
