Personnel Specialist 2nd Class January Davidson Commander, Navy Reserve Forces Command

Personnel Specialist 2nd Class January Davidson began her Navy career at Customer Service Detachment Millington, Tenn., from 1995 to 1996. She then transferred to the Inactive Ready Reserves for a period of seven years before returning to the Naval Reserves Sept. 2002. She was quickly picked up to perform security with a small boat unit (IBU 26) out of Wilmington, N.C. After returning from deployment to Souda Bay, Greece, in 2003 she transferred to the Mobilization Team at Camp Lejeune, N.C. In 2004, she returned to Full Time Support status and transferred to Navy Operation and Support Center Great Lakes, Ill. In 2006, she transferred to South Central Regional Maintenance Center Ingleside, Texas. In 2009 she then transferred to Commander, Navy Reserve Forces Command (COMNAVRESFORCOM) and is currently the "A" School and Recruiting Selective Conversion Reenlistment – Reserve (RESCORE-R) program manager responsible for obtaining quotas, funding the orders and tracking to completion all "A" school requirements for reservists force wide.

Some of Petty Officer Davidson's recent accomplishments include selection as COMNAVRESFORCOM Junior Sailor of the Year. As the Navy RESCORE-R Program Manager and "A" school fund approver, she has approved 4,492 sets of Annual Training/Active Duty for Training orders and 432 sets of RESCORE-R orders accounting for more than \$1.5 million. This training is essential to Total Force Readiness.

As an assistant command fitness leader, Petty Officer Davidson runs the command Fitness Enhancement Program (FEP) and has helped 17 Sailors losing a total of 918 pounds, bringing them into Physical Fitness Assessment standards and off of FEP, which assisted them in saving their Navy careers. Consistently leads by example by scoring outstanding on her PFAs.

Petty Officer Davidson runs a Yeoman and Personnel Specialist department rating exam study group for her peers and subordinates which has raised exam scores by 35 percent. Her most recent volunteer work includes the Shamrock run which is a half marathon charity run for cancer research and also volunteers her time to senior citizens programs. She is a member of the COMNAVRESFORCOM Color Guard, and was awarded her fifth Navy and Marine Corps Achievement medal. Petty Officer Davidson has earned her Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice.
