Selection Board Tips – It's your record, review it.

It's time again for another round of selection boards. Sailors are reminded to check their records frequently to ensure all of their information is present and correct. Sailors can log on to BUPERS Online (BOL) at any time to check their Official Military Personnel Record.

To check records, Sailors need only go to <https://www.bol.navy.mil> and click on the "Official Military Personnel File (OMPF) – My Record" link. Navy performance evaluation continuity, awards, training and qualifications are the significant areas for Sailors to focus on when checking their OMPF for accuracy. [BUPERSINST 1070.27C](#) outlines all items that should be submitted to the OMPF on officer and enlisted personnel.

Recently submitted documents may not yet appear in a record. If a document was sent to NPC within the past 60 days, they may still be in processing, so do not resend. After 60 days, if the document still has not appeared in the OMPF, contact NPC (PERS-313) by e-mail to the organizational mail box at mill_ompf-chg@navy.mil prior to resubmitting the documents. Remember, a document will not be placed into the OMPF that was submitted directly by the Sailor. The servicing PSD or Personnel Office is the primary source for submitting documents (Officer and Enlisted) to the Navy Personnel Command for updating the OMPF.

Lastly, ensure you meet deadlines for submission to the board, documentation received after deadlines will NOT be accepted.

If you have what it takes (and meet the eligibility requirements), for a demanding and rewarding experience in New Construction, LCAC's, or Littoral Combat Ship (LCS), ask your rating detailer about Sea Special Programs. There is nothing like the experience of becoming a "plank owner". The new construction pipeline will often give you access to rating schools that are not available to the rest of the fleet. In addition to schools, you'll have the satisfaction of breathing life into a newly commissioned ship and placing that ship in service. Currently we have LCS 1 and LCS 2 in San Diego. PCU LPD-24 going to Norfolk, PCU LPD -22 and PCU LPD-23 going to San Diego, and PCU DDG-112 going to Pearl Harbor Hawaii.
